The suture line is relatively simple, with the first lateral lobe a little larger than the ventral lobe and asymmetrical and four to six much smaller and rather narrow additional lobes between it and the line of involution. The dorsal suture contains four slender lobes on each side of the dorsal lobe. The most distinctive characters are the nodose or spinose ornament, particularly on the midline of the venter, and the forward arching of the ribs on the venter. In this paper five species of Neogastroplites are recognized, each containing infrasubspecific...
