

Printer with the Treasurer of the United States should be covered into the Treasury to the credit of the appropriations from which it was drawn. (2) In our investigation of the accounts we found no evidence of fraud. There are, however, some serious irregularities chargeable, in most cases, to bad administration. There were a number of vouchers showing payments to the audit system for materials and supplies furnished during the time this corporation was engaged in installing a system of cost keeping and accounting in this office. When it is considered how closely the officers and employees of this corporation were related to the management of this office, the awarding of contracts to said corporation for supplies would seem to be not only bad administration, but suggests a violation of the spirit and intent, if not the letter, of the law as contained in section 34 of the printing act approved January 12, 1895, which provides: Neither the Public Printer, chief clerk, foreman of printing, foreman of binding, nor any of their assistants shall, during their continuance in office, have any interest, direct or indirect, in the publication of any newspaper or perodical, or in any printing, binding, engraving, or lithographing of any kind, or in any contract for furnishing paper or other material connected with the public printing, binding, lithographing, or engraving; and for every violation of this section the party offending shall, on conviction before any court of competent jurisdiction, be imprisoned in the...
